







# Minutes Away, Worlds Apart: A Historical Take on Saratoga's Mountain Winery

Though it's just a little under four miles from the Safeway and Starbuck's at Argonaut Shopping Center, driving the final segment of the elevated grapevine-laden road to the Mountain Winery feels like being in North Bay Wine Country or even Italy. But reach the destination and take in the views overlooking Silicon Valley, and it's clear that one is in the hills of Saratoga at the historical space once owned by the late vintner Paul Masson.

"Our motto is 'Minutes away, worlds apart," says Dave House, Mountain Winery coowner and Managing Partner. "We're quick and easy to get to. When you're there, you're in an altogether different place."

The Mountain Winery is best known for its summer concert season, which ends this month with performances by actor/ author/comedian/ musician Steve Martin and actor/comedian/ occasional vocalist Martin Short (October 4); pop-reggae veterans UB40 featuring Ali Campbell and Astro (October 5); chamber rock heroes Calexico and Iron & Wine (October 6); actor/ "American Humorist" / wood craftsman Nick Offerman (October 11); and comedian/actor Bill Burr (October 18). "But we're a twelvemonth-a-year operation, even though we only have concerts for five," House points out, by phone from Wisconsin earlier this summer.

Having expanded to non-concert public activities, as well, the Winery follows up its 2019 season with an all-ages Dia De Los Muertos gathering on Sunday, November 3. Running from 2:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m., its Day of the Dead celebration will feature music, dancing, face painting and children's activities with vendors selling regional Mexican food and drink.

"We also do corporate events. We do anniversary parties and birthday parties and graduation parties," he continues, while aboard his boat in the Badger State. "We do corporate team building and corporate strategy sessions, as well—everything you can imagine.

"Of course, we have such a unique setting," he notes. "This is so much different than going to a hotel or a conference room."

"The food was excellent," reports Edith Maciel of Saratoga, reflecting on the dishes served at the Mountain Winery surprise birthday party that one of her daughters threw for another. A patron of both SASCC's Adult Care Center and R.Y.D.E. programs, she continues, "Everything was excellent. They did a very good job."

A native of Burgundy, France, Masson came to Saratoga by way of San Francisco at the Turn of the (20th) Century. Completed in 1905, destroyed by the San Francisco Earthquake a year later and rebuilt in 1907, his "Vineyard in the Sky" in Saratoga survived Prohibition and remained in his hands until he sold it in 1936.

An informal amphitheatre was built in 1958, which also marked the winery's first summer concert series. Folding chairs



made way for bleachertype benches. "The folding chairs were zip-tied together and were on the asphalt. And it was just dirt before that," House recalls, with a chuckle, reminiscing about the historic state of the Winery prior to several rounds of remodeling. "When the first three rows moved their head a little, you had to move yours around!"

In 2001, House (who is also House Family Vineyards Proprietor and is on the Board of Trustees of the Computer History Museum) bought the Mountain Winery with tech entrepreneur Jack Smith and real estate developers Liz Dodson and Bill Hirschman. The bowl was remodeled in 2008 and retains its intimacy while providing modern conveniences and more sections of elevated seating with a new capacity of 2545.

When it was Paul Masson Mountain Winery, concerts by the likes of Ella Fitzgerald, Ray Charles and Roy Orbison reflected the living legends-oriented bookings philosophy. With AEG Presents booking shows since 2012, artists have ranged from still-active greats such as Stevie Wonder, Diana Ross and The Beach Boys to next generation stars including singer/songwriters Erykah Badu,



When Duran Duran played the second of two sold out nights in September, lead vocalist and frontman Simon LeBron praised the unique "vibe" of the setting before going on to joke that it's really the scents that are so memorable from the smell of wine when the British band first started playing there (in 2009) to that of beer and pizza this time around. Indeed, fine and casual dining have each been part of the Winery's identity in addition to its Thursdays through Sundays and pre-concert day wine tastings.

Whether one is seated on the Winery Deck Patio overlooking the South Bay or at Chateau La Cresta above the bandstand or consuming something bought at one of the concessions stands

above the concert bowl, both more formal and quick and casual dining options are available for concertgoers (with the former two also available for private events).

"We put in a brand new kitchen out there, which is under the deck that's next to the Chateau, and we put in a new kitchen in the Winery Room," House says. "So we have very top-level commercial kitchens now. They can prepare much better food than we could do before, and we just have better capacity.

"We're proud to be a member of the Saratoga community," House concludes. "We maintain close relationships with everybody in Saratoga—with the government, chamber of commerce and city council members. And we look forward to continuing to host guests throughout the year."



## Chinese Calligraphy returns to SASCC!

Introduction to Chinese Calligraphy Art is a course of four weeks, 90 minute length for those who want to learn basic Chinese calligraphy, the structure of its characters, and the Chinese Culture. At the end of the course, we will learn about 100 Chinese words and be able to write them in calligraphy. Chinese calligraphy is a demonstration of the strokes of Chinese characters and the meaning of those characters in a form, similar to the Western sketch, with a unique Chinese brush, black ink on a kind of special paper.




The Chinese Calligraphy Course will be held every Thursday, Oct. 3, 10, 17, & 31, 2019, from 9-10:30 a.m.

New regulations on leaf blower use in Saratoga will go into effect on October 1. They specify that leaf blowers must not produce any more than 65 decibels at a distance of 50 feet. This is part of an effort to reduce noise pollution in Saratoga. In addition to this, leaf blowers may only be used Monday through Friday between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m, on Saturdays between 10 a.m. and 5 p.m, and not on Sundays at all.


